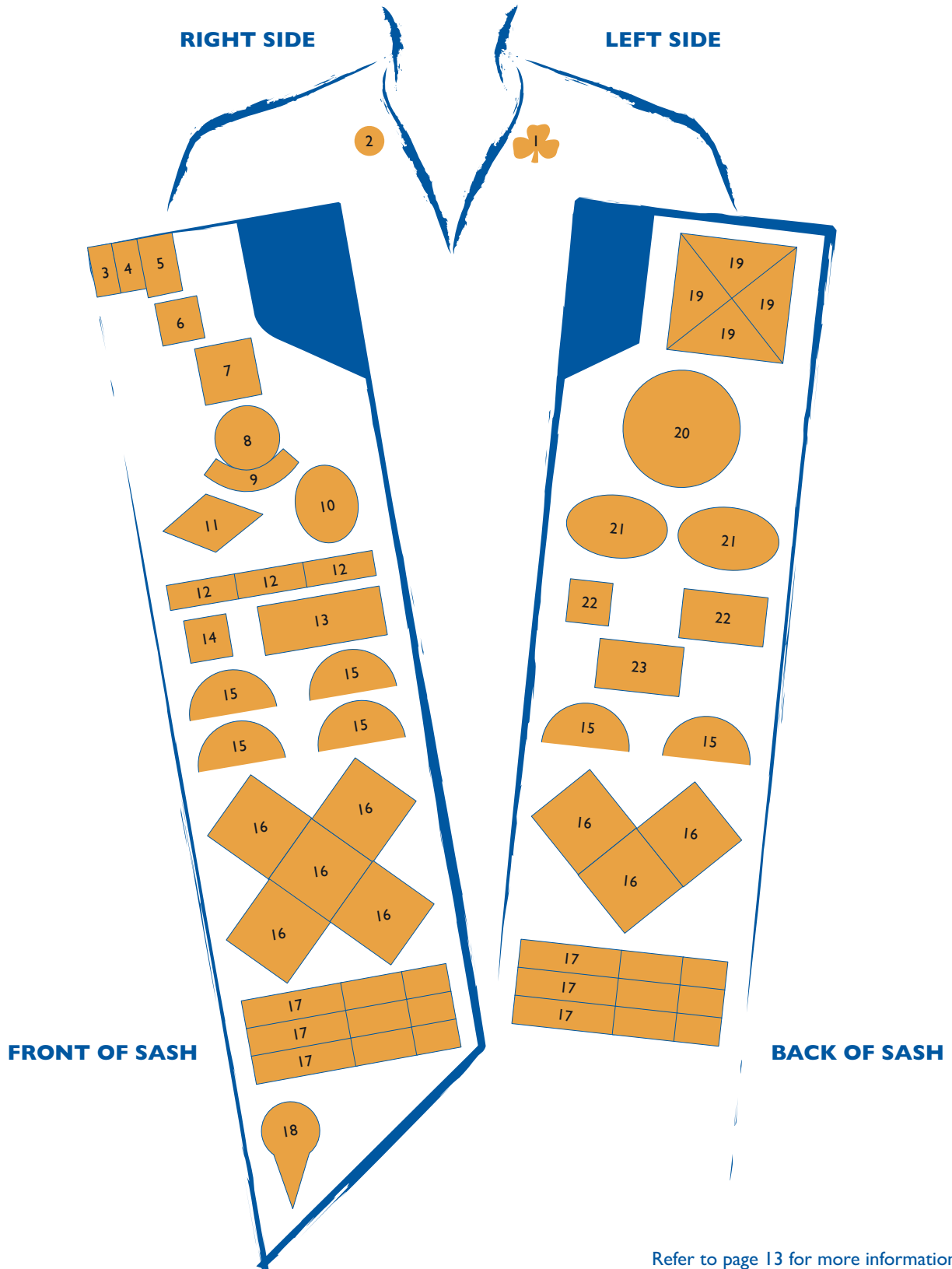

BADGE PLACEMENT WHEN WEARING SASH



UNIFORM GUIDELINES

Badge placement for Girls and Tween shirts to be as follows:

Shirt Collars (or equivalent position on V-neck options)

- 1 Promise Badge
- 2 World Badge

Front of Sash

- 3 Unit Tape on the outside (across the shoulder)
- 4 District, Division, Area or Region tape on the inside (closer to the neck than the Unit tape): wear up to two tapes only, in hierarchical order
- 5 Girl Guides Australia Flash (on outside)
- 6 Membership star
- 7 State badge
- 8 Patrol emblem
- 9 Patrol Leader/Second stripe
- 10 Endeavours under PL stripes. Each Endeavour is replaced when you get the relevant peak award (i.e you could have bronze and silver on the sash and once the CP Award is earned, then the CP Award replaces the Silver Endeavour)
- 11 Award badges. As stated above, Award badges replace Endeavours once the relevant peak award is earned
- 12 Service Flash
- 13 Action Guide badge
- 14 Progression challenge
- 15 Explore a Challenges (four in total in rows of two)
- 16 Create a Challenges (five in total in diamond figure)
- 17 Achieve a Challenges
- 18 Triple Treat badge or equivalent

Back of Sash

- 19 WAGGGS Centenary badge
- 20 GGA Centenary Challenge badge
- 21 GAT badge
- 22 Special events (go to www.girlguides.org.au for more details)
- 23 JOTA/JOTI
Any other Explore, Create and/or Achieve badges.



International badges

For members selected to represent Girl Guides Australia at international events, the Girl Guides Australia Flash may be replaced with an Australian flag cloth badge. An Australian flag cloth badge may also be worn on the left shoulder of the shirt. The Australian flag cloth badge remains in place on return to Australia. It does not need to be removed.

The metal Australia badge may be worn on the sash in place of the State badge. (The State badge must be removed whilst the Australia badge is in place.) This badge can only be worn whilst overseas—it must be removed from the sash on returning to Australia.

Additional notes

- Region, area, Division and District badges (other than tapes) are not to be worn on the sash.
- Thinking Day and Guide Biscuit badges are not to be worn on the sash.
- Only two Centenary badges are to be worn on the sash – WAGGGS Centenary badge (four segments available during 2010 and 2012) and the GGA Centenary Challenge badge.
